Well, its wintertime and that means that it's time to go camping. This will be our yearly camping trip in Yosemite. I would like to express my excitement and joy over our planning for this year's Winter Camp. Winter camping can be fun and exciting, but it requires a little more attention to detail than in the summer. It is obvious that the elements are more of a factor; therefore, it is important to read all the instructions in this packet and to attend the meeting on the 12th of February at 7:30 pm in The Zone. CAMPSITE:

We will be camping at the Upper Pines Campground in Yosemite National Park. This site offers hot showers, sinks for washing, fire pits, BBQ pits and lockable food storage. In addition, we will be very close to Yosemite's information center and a General Store due to the fact that most of our men and boys lack experience in winter camping. This is one of the reasons we chose this site.



EVENTS:

Our men and boys will experience the awesome beauty of Yosemite. It truly is one of God's most beautiful creations. Events will include our Annual Yosemite Adventure Race, ice skating, Ranger games, evening services, and council fires plus possibly a history and nature talk with one of the parks knowledgeable Rangers.

SCHEDULE:

Wednesday Night, 2/12/20: Parent meeting with leadership team in The Zone at 7:45 p.m.

<u>Friday, 2/21/20</u>: Travel to Yosemite, stow gear and enjoy camp, activities, games and evening service.

Saturday, 2/22/20: Adventure Race, camp events, games and Fire side evening service.

Sunday, 2/23/20: Morning devotion, pack up and return home.

COST:

\$98.00 per person includes all meals at camp, transportation, camp fees, etc. Camp payment is due Thursday, 2/20/20 or before departure. Registration is required.

CLOTHING:

What you wear in cold weather is very important. What you want to keep in mind is what an outdoorsman refers to as layering. This simply is wearing layer upon layer of clothing to keep you warm. I hope you don't feel that you have to spend a lot of money on clothes, you don't. **You might be able to rent snow clothes and boots.** Wool is an excellent material, plus there are a variety of synthetic materials to choose from. Cotton will also work using the layering system. If there is only one thing that you can spend money on, spend it on a pair of boots (leather boots, snow boots, PAC boots).

ADULT REQUIREMENTS:

All adults attending camp must be fingerprinted here at The Bay Church prior to departure. If you have been fingerprinted at The Bay Church before, you have already met this requirement. You will be notified if you will need to be fingerprinted prior to departure.

WHAT TO BRING:

- Sack breakfast or \$10 to \$12 to buy breakfast for Friday morning departure.
- \$10 to \$12 for lunch on the way home (boys do get hungry)
- Sleeping bag (rated to 10 degrees)
- Two blankets (three blankets if your sleeping bag is not rated to 10 degrees)
- 6 by 6 foot plastic tarp
- Air mattress (optional)
- Pillow
- Snow suit if you have one and Parka (You might be able to rent these items)
- Warm hat (70% of your body heat escapes through your head)
- Warm Gloves
- Jacket or coat
- Sweat shirts
- Blue jeans
- T-shirts, underwear, Long underwear very important (remember layering)
- Socks (wool over synthetic is great also synthetic blends, and lots of them)
- Shoes (leather boots, snow boots or PAC boots) (You might be able to rent these items)
- Snow Seal (yes that's what it's called... it's for sealing leather boots only)
- Rain Poncho (you can make them out of plastic garbage bags)
- PI's
- Plastic bag (dirty clothes)
- Toilet Kit (soap, washcloth, towel, toothbrush and toothpaste)
- Small day pack (Backpack)
- Canteen
- Flashlight (extra batteries)
- Sun Protection (snow, wind and sun can burn)
- Sun glasses (optional, but remember the sun is bright off the snow)
- Knife (with cut & chop card)
- One roll toilet paper
- Duffel bag or suitcase
- Insect repellent
- Bible
- Paper and Pencil
- Spending money (that's your call as a parent but let me know how much and
 if you're giving your son spending money) there is a nice gift shop in
 Yosemite Valley for souvenirs'.

WHAT NOT TO BRING:

All tents, food, camping and cooking gear will be provided by Royal Rangers Outpost 5. Do not bring game systems, electronic devices, etc.

CONCLUSION:

I hope this will be a great experience for your son and one that he will not soon forget. It is my hope that he will enjoy God's great outdoors, fellowship with other boy's and experience a closer walk with God. If I can be of any help or answer any questions, feel free to give me a call.
